

With 2024 polls in mind, BJP assigns 3 Union mins to WB

New Delhi: Keen to defend the ground that BJP gained in West Bengal in the 2019 Lok Sabha polls with an unprecedented 10 of 42 parliamentary seats, the party leadership has already planned its moves for the 2024 contest with at least three Union ministers tasked to focus on the state.

Union ministers Dharmendra Pradhan, Smriti Irani and Jyotiraditya Scindia have been deputed for the state.

They have started taking stock of issues since BJP lost some ground and Mamata Banerjee's TMC registered a landslide victory in the 2021 assembly polls for a third consecutive term in office. Others like Rajya Sabha MP Rakesh Sinha are also expected to be roped in later.

With ex-Bengal governor Jagdeep Dhankhar having moved out of Raj Bhavan in Kolkata to become the vice-president, the pressure from the Centre on the state government, will now have to be mounted through various channels, according to party insiders.

SC grants bail to Varavara in Bhima-Koregaon case

New Delhi: The Supreme Court on Wednesday granted regular bail to Telugu poet Varavara Rao on medical grounds in the Bhima-Koregaon case in which he is being prosecuted for allegedly indulging in anti-national activities.

A bench of Justices U U Lalit, Aniruddha Bose and Sudhanshu Dhulia allowed the plea of Rao, who approached the apex court against the Bombay high court order of granting him interim bail for only six months for medical treatment.

The order preceded the lengthy hearing, during which the NIA said Rao was not granted any relief and cited that the apex court had turned down the bail plea of self-styled godman Asaram who was also above 80 years old and suffering from various ailments. Rao, on the other hand, contended that NIA was not interested in the trial and the agency wanted him to die in jail like Father Stan Swamy.

Rao, 83, was granted interim bail for six months in February last year, and the court kept it extended; he is still out on bail. As he was not granted regular bail by HC, he approached the apex court.

The case against him relates to alleged inflammatory speeches made at the Elgar Parishad conference held in Pune on December 31, 2017, which Pune police claimed triggered violence the next day near the Koregaon-Bhima war memorial on the outskirts of the western Maharashtra city. Police had also claimed that the conclave was organised by people with alleged Maoist links. The NIA later took over the probe into the matter.

Majithia walks out of Patiala jail after HC grants him bail

Chandigarh: After spending more than five months in the Patiala jail in a drug case, senior SAD member Bikram Singh Majithia was granted bail by the Punjab and Haryana high court on Wednesday.

The SAD member walked out of the jail around 8.30pm, and was greeted outside the prison by a large number of party workers, who showered petalons his vehicle.

A division bench comprising Justices MS Rameshwar Thakur passed the order while leaving Majithia's bail plea. "We are satisfied that reasonable grounds exist to believe that the petitioner is not guilty of the offences alleged against him... and he is not likely to commit such offences while on bail. It will take time for the trial to start and culminate. So, no fruitful purpose is going to be served even if the petitioner is kept in judicial custody for a further indefinite period. We are of the opinion that continued detention of the petitioner, which started on February 24, 2022, is not warranted and he is entitled to be released on bail," the court observed.

It said there is no material placed on record showing possession, transportation, sale or recovery of any contraband from the petitioner.

'With few kids in adoption pool, avg referral time for parents is 2 years'

New Delhi: A parliamentary panel in a report on the review of guardianship and adoption laws has highlighted that with few children available in the adoption pool, average time taken for prospective adoptive parents (PAAs) registered with the Central Adoption Resource Authority (CARA) to get a referral for children in the age group of 0-4 years is approximately two years.

The report tabled in the just concluded monsoon session of Parliament on Monday noted with "grave concern" that as per the adoption statistics of CARA, the number of children adopted in the country declined from 5,693 in 2010 to 3,142 in 2020-21. Also the number of

children taken in inter-country adoption showed a sharp fall from 628 in 2010 to 417 in 2020-21.

As per the information furnished by CARA, as on December 16, 2021, as many as 26,734 PAAs had registered with CARA and were waiting for referral for in-country adoption and

1,265 prospective adoptive parents were awaiting inter-country adoption.

As per the information furnished to the department, standing committee on personnel, public grievances, law and justice, by the ministry of women and child development, the average time taken for PAAs to get a referral for children in the age group of 0-4 years is approximately two years. Data provided by CARA, as on December 16, 2021, shows that a total of 6,894 orphaned/abandoned/surrendered children are residing in child care institutions linked with specialised adoption agencies, out of which 2,430 were declared legally free for adoption.

BJP elevates Sunil Bansal as nat'l gen secy; given charge of 3 states

New Delhi: BJP chief JP Nadda on Wednesday elevated party's pointperson for UP Sunil Bansal as national general secretary assigning him the responsibility of West Bengal, Odisha and Telangana, in what marks a big leap up the poll strategist who played a key role in BJP's poll victories in the largest state.

Dharampal, an OBC functionary who was the general

secretary organisation for Charkhand, has been shifted in the same capacity to UP, in place of Bansal whose work in UP since 2014 under Amit Shah, now the Union home minister, has been acknowledged as a key factor in the party's UP victories. Karanveer, Bansal's deputy in UP, has also been elevated as general secretary in charge of organisation for Jharkhand.

The party sees all the three states, which will form part of

Bansal's portfolio, as crucial for party's plans to secure another term at the Centre in 2024.

Bengal has for long been without an effective organisational oversight since its performance failed to measure up to the expectations in the assembly polls of 2020. Although Kailash Vijayvargya remains in charge of the state as general secretary, he has looked subdued since the resounding defeat at TMC's hands.

Delhi gang sold call records; detective agencies under lens

New Delhi: The initial probe into the call details record (CDR) racket busted by Delhi Police suggests that gang members, who worked in private detective agencies, may have illegally obtained details of at least 1,000 numbers in the past four-five years.

At least six detective agencies are under the scanner, sources said. The gang, police said, charged their "customers" Rs 9,600 for a month's call details, Rs 18,000 for six months and Rs 25,000 for one year. The syndicate also provided "live locations" of people for Rs 5,500 and a year's bank statement for Rs 15,000, said a source. The rate list came to the fore after cops stumbled upon a WhatsApp group where nearly 100 people from various detective agencies. A message detailing the rates was posted by one of the members, whom cops are trying to trace.

On Monday, police laid a trap and arrested Pawan Kumar from Rohini. Kumar, who works for a Noida-based detective agency, had claimed the gang had contacts in various police forces out

side Delhi and that several detective agencies were involved in snooping. On Wednesday, Delhi Police claimed that no one from the force had emerged as a suspect till now and that Kumar's questioning suggested the involvement of cops from other states.

Delhi Police said they will write to telecom service providers and seek details to ascertain where the requests for the numbers came from.

The kingpin of the CDR racket, who runs a private detective agency, is currently on the run. He was earlier investigated by Jaipur police in a similar case, according to an officer who is investigating the matter.

Kumar had been in the business for about five years, cops said, adding that they were trying to ascertain the identity of people who had sold call detail records to "The accused has revealed that most of the CDRs were related to matrimonial disputes, extramarital affairs. We suspect that call details of businessmen, private firms and employees of various companies were also sold for money," said an official.

Raju Srivastava suffers heart attack during workout

New Delhi: Popular comedian actor Raju Srivastava on Wednesday was rushed to AIIMS following a heart attack and is currently in the coronary care unit, said hospital sources.

"Srivastava, 56, had to be resuscitated thrice. He was rushed to the intensive care unit and underwent angioplasty," said a hospital source.

Srivastava's cousin Ashok said the comedian suffered the heart attack while exercising.

"He was doing his routine exercise and while he was on the treadmill, he suddenly fell. He suffered a heart attack and was immediately taken to AIIMS," he said, adding that the actor-comedian's wife Shikha has reached Delhi to be with him.

Earlier in the day, Srivastava's colleague Sunil Pal said the comedian was doing much better. "He is doing fine now. He is out of danger," Pal said in a video he shared with the media.
